

Laws, Labels and Liberation: REVISITED

A conference to expose and oppose the labeling of movements for national and social liberation as terrorist organizations.

In the wake of the September 11, 2001 attacks on the World Trade Center and the Pentagon, the Canadian government enacted legislation creating a list of designated terrorist organizations and criminal code amendments making it a criminal offense to support listed organizations.

The terrorist lists are part of an all out offensive against political leaders and movements resisting neoliberal globalization, re-colonization and imperialism, using the cover of the general state of concern over the September 11, 2001 attacks.

In the context of mounting attacks on the movements for national and social liberation, and as we approach the 5th Anniversary of the U.S. led invasion and occupation of Iraq, there is an urgent need to reaffirm the right of peoples to struggle for national and social liberation and to challenge the laws and labels that seek to suppress these struggles.
